Collins Radio Company


- 1961: Collins' Western Division moves from Burbank, CA to Newport Beach, CA

(Rockwell Semiconductor Division)


- 1967: Rockwell starts manufacturing MOSFET chips

- 1981 to 1998: Summer Intern and Mentoring Programs Coordinator






Southwest Test Workshop

- 1991: Recognized the need for a dedicated forum on all aspects of microelectronic wafer probe testing that deals with "real world" problems and solutions
 - 40 technologists attended the first workshop
 - Unique "Presentation only" format (i.e., no technical manuscript)
 - All presentations made available in the public domain
 - Relaxed atmosphere that balanced a technical program (~50%)
 with open discussions, social activities, and networking (~50%)



Southwest Test Workshop (now the SW Test Workshop)

- 1992 to present: SWTW has grown to become a premier test workshop and the largest of the 30 conference or symposiums sponsored by the TTTC
 - Over 400 technologists from around the world attend each year
 - Technical program with 9-sessions and 29-presentations that often include new technologies and product introductions
 - Over 40 exhibits of probe-related products and services
 - Open discussions, social activities, and networking remain an integral part of the workshop and are highly encouraged







